DENISE COLEMAN APT, Iola, elected to the State Board of Education, District No. 9 in the November, 1978, General Election, has been a member of the president of the Board of Education, U.S.D. No. 257 for thirteen years. She has also served as President of the Kansas Association of School Boards and has been on its board of directors for six years. Recently she was asked to be an educator-in-residence in the Education Department at the University of Kansas and was the first lay person to be so honored.
